BOARDS Care Instructions

IN ACTION WITH YOUR BOARD

- When you go on the water you should ensure that the airscrew of your board is firmly seated.
- While giving your board a break from being on the water remove the airscrew allowing the air
 to circulate freely. Never leave the airscrew in your board on a warm or even hot day as the air
 inside will expand and may put undue pressure on the struture of the board.

STORAGE OF YOUR BOARD

- UV rays may damage the structure of your board, cause its color to fade, let the kneepads shrink or the handles may become porous on the long term. Always protect your board by keeping it in a bag or inside a storage area, ensure that the board is dry before storing.
- Try to store your board on padded racks off the ground to avoid scratches on the hull.
- Wash your board thoroughly with fresh water after every use to reduce any corrosion from salt or polluted water.

REGULAR CHECK-UPS

- Before using your board you should regularly check that your fin and handles are well tightened and in good condition.
- Always make sure that your board is free from cracks or damages that may cause water to get into your board. If you find any ding or crack, keep your board out of the water and rinse it out thoroughly with fresh water, let this area dry and get it repaired.

TRANSPORTATION OF YOUR BOARD

- When tying your board to the roof rack you should make sure that it is securely tightened but also don't over tighten the straps and risk your board to suffer damage.
- Use proper straps to fix your board to reduce the chances of your board being damaged and to ensure it is as secure as possible.
